Before you start

A few minutes spent on these checks before you begin will save time and prevent headaches later:

- Verify the rolling door is correctly installed, balanced, and operates freely before fitting an opener.
- Confirm the opener model is rated for the door's weight and size.
- Ensure the barrel and spring assembly are in good condition.
- Check that the power supply matches the opener's electrical

specifications.

Getting these basics right means your opener will perform as it should from day one.

General installation process

1. Confirm door balance Manually operate the rolling door through its full travel to verify it moves freely and is correctly balanced before fitting the opener. A door that isn't balanced properly will stress

the motor and shorten its life.

2. Mount the motor to the barrel - The RDO-1v4 motor mounts directly onto the door barrel/drum assembly. - Fit the motor mounting bracket to the side of the hood at the barrel end as specified in the installation manual. - Engage the motor drive coupling to the barrel shaft.

Follow the manual's specifications precisely here — correct alignment directly affects how quietly and smoothly the door runs.

3. Run wiring - Route the power cable and wall button cable per the wiring diagram in the manual. - For external installations, house all wiring in appropriate conduit to protect against weather ingress.

4. Power up and set limits - Apply power and initiate the limit-setting sequence per the manual. - Run the door to the fully open position and set the open limit. - Run the door to the fully closed position and set the close limit. - Confirm the door seats firmly against the floor seal when closed.

5. Set force/auto-reverse - Adjust force settings so the door will auto-reverse if it encounters an obstruction on closing. - Test by placing a 40 mm timber block under the bottom rail and closing — the door must reverse immediately upon contact.

Don't skip this step. Auto-reverse is a critical safety function — verify it's working correctly before finishing the installation.

6. Code remotes - Code handset transmitters and keypads per the coding guide for your model. - Test range and operation from the furthest expected use position.

7. Final checks - Check that no wiring is chafing on moving parts. - Confirm the motor housing is secure and the hood is correctly seated. - Test the manual release to confirm the door can be operated by hand during a power failure.

Safety & compliance

Rolling door opener installation must comply with ****AS/NZS 60335.2.95**** (Automatic garage door systems). The manual release must be accessible and functional at all times — this is a hard requirement, not optional.
