Before you start

- Verify the opener model and its suitability for the door type and weight — check the rated door weight in the opener manual.
- Make sure the door is correctly installed, balanced, and operating freely before

fitting an opener. - Check available headroom for drive rail clearance above the door. - Confirm that the power supply matches the opener's electrical requirements.

General installation process

Work through these steps in order. Each one builds on the last, so skipping ahead tends to create problems you'll need to come back and fix. Check your model's manual at each stage for anything specific to your opener.

1. Confirm door balance Before fitting any opener, disconnect the door from any existing opener and manually lift it to mid-travel. A properly balanced door stays put without support. If it drops or rises on its own, the spring balance needs adjusting before you go any further — this is a critical safety check, not an optional one.

2. Fit the drive rail Assemble the drive rail (track) sections as detailed in the manual. Attach the front bracket to the header above the door and the rear bracket to the ceiling or a structural member. The drive rail must be level and aligned with the centre of the door for smooth, reliable operation.

3. Mount the motor unit Hang the motor unit from the ceiling bracket at the rear of the drive rail. The drive rail should sit 50–100 mm above the door in the fully open position — check your manual for the exact height requirement for your model.

4. Attach the opener bracket to the door Fit the opener bracket to the top section of the door at the centre stile, then connect the trolley arm from the drive rail trolley to the door bracket. Adjust the arm length so the door moves squarely and without binding.

5. Electrical connection Connect the opener to the power supply as per the wiring diagram in your manual, and connect wall button wiring to the terminal block. For SmartPro models, connect the Wi-Fi antenna and follow the app pairing procedure in the manual to get full smart control up and running.

6. Set travel limits Run the opener through the initial limit-setting mode as described in the manual. Set the fully open and fully closed positions so the door seats correctly against weatherseals when closed and fully clears the opening when open.

7. Set force/sensitivity Adjust the motor force setting (auto-reverse sensitivity) as directed in the manual. To test auto-reverse, place a 40 mm timber block under the door and close it — the door must reverse on contact. This test is non-negotiable.

8. Fit and code remotes & accessories Code handset transmitters and wall-mounted keypads using the remote coding guide for your model. If you're fitting safety beams, refer to the [Safety Beam Installation Guide](<https://www.bnd.com.au/trade-resources/installation-manuals/safety-security-manual/>) for full instructions.

Safety & compliance

Correct installation is what makes the safety features built into every B&D; opener actually work. Keep these requirements in mind throughout the process.

- Installation must comply with **AS/NZS 60335.2.95** (Automatic garage door systems) and applicable Australian Building Codes. - Safety beams are strongly recommended and required in some jurisdictions. Refer to the [Residential Door Opener Access document (PDF)](https://admin.bnd.com.au/media/igvlnrmm/07_residentialdooropeneraccess_jun16_webpdf.pdf) for full guidance. - Once installation is complete, display the warning sign prominently near the door so all users can see it.
