

B&D; Secure vs Smart vs Smart Pro: Sectional Door Opener Showdown

****Choosing the right garage door opener can feel overwhelming — especially when B&D; offers three distinct models in the same family.**** The B&D; Controll-A-Door® Secure, Smart, and Smart Pro are all built for sectional garage doors, but each targets a different homeowner. Whether you want dependable basics, smartphone control, or a premium setup for a large, heavy door, this guide breaks down exactly what separates them and which one deserves a spot in your garage.

At a Glance: Which Opener Is Right for You?

- ****B&D; Secure (SDO-6V3)**** — The entry-level workhorse. Reliable operation, 235 kg door capacity, and no-frills performance for homeowners who just want a quality opener without the extras. - ****B&D; Smart (SDO-7V3)**** — The sweet spot for most Australian homes. Same 235 kg capacity as the Secure, but adds smartphone control capability (via the Smart Hub, already installed) and an LED courtesy light. - ****B&D; Smart Pro (SDO-9V3)**** — The premium choice. Built-in Wi-Fi with Smart Hub pre-installed, 300 kg door capacity, 220 W motor, dual LED courtesy lights, and the quietest operation of the three. Built for larger, heavier doors and homeowners who want everything.

What All Three Openers Share

First, here's what the Secure, Smart, and Smart Pro all have in common. These shared features represent the B&D; engineering DNA that runs through the entire Controll-A-Door® sectional range.

Tri-Tran+ Remote Security

Every opener in this lineup uses B&D;'s ****Tri-Tran+ multi-frequency technology****. Your remote transmitter sends signals across three frequencies simultaneously — 433.47 MHz, 433.92 MHz, and 434.37 MHz — which dramatically reduces interference from other household electronics and neighbouring garage doors.

More importantly, Tri-Tran+ uses ****code-hopping encryption****. Every single button press generates a new security code from over ****4.29 billion possible combinations**** using a non-linear encryption algorithm. Even if someone intercepted your signal, that code is immediately useless for the next operation. Code grabbing is effectively dead with Tri-Tran+.

Remote Capacity

All three models feature a **multi-frequency receiver** with storage for up to **64 four-button transmitters**. That is more than enough for a family home — each family member can have their own remote with buttons to spare for a second garage or gate. Transmitters run on standard **CR2032 coin cell batteries** (3V).

Auto-Reverse and Obstruction Detection

Safety is non-negotiable across the range. All three openers include **automatic safety reverse** — if the door encounters an obstruction while closing, it immediately reverses direction. The system continuously monitors closing force, and the LED indicators on the control panel flash and beep to alert you when an obstruction is detected.

Sectional Door Compatibility

The Secure, Smart, and Smart Pro are all purpose-built for sectional garage doors. They require a **minimum headroom clearance of just 57 mm** above the door, making them suitable for garages with tight ceiling spaces. All doors must be properly balanced and able to be operated by hand in accordance with **AS/NZS 4505:2012** standards.

Vacation Mode

Heading away on holiday? All three openers include a **Vacation Mode** that disables remote transmitter access while you are away. This prevents any unauthorised operation of your garage door, adding an extra layer of security when the house is unattended.

Auto-Close Function

A configurable **auto-close timer** is available across the range. Set it and forget it — the door will automatically close after a pre-set period, so you never have to wonder whether you left the garage open.

Manual Release Cord

In the event of a power outage (or if you simply need to disengage the opener), every model includes a **manual release cord**. This allows you to manually open and close the door without the motor. The cord should be adjusted to a height of less than 1.8 metres for easy access by an adult.

Speed Settings

All three openers offer **three drive speed modes**: Fast (default, 3 beeps), Medium (2 beeps), and Slow (1 beep). This is particularly important for larger or heavier doors where slower operation may be safer and quieter. Speed adjustments must be made before setting the travel limits.

10-Year Total Confidence Warranty Eligibility

When you purchase a complete B&D; door and opener system and register it online, you are eligible for the **B&D; 10-Year Total Confidence Warranty** on selected components. This extended coverage demonstrates B&D;'s commitment to long-term reliability and gives you peace of mind well beyond the standard warranty period.

B&D; Secure (SDO-6V3): Reliable Basics Done Right

The B&D; Secure is the entry point to the Controll-A-Door® sectional range, and it earns its place not by cutting corners, but by focusing on what matters most: dependable, safe garage door operation.

It is also a strong choice for **rental properties, secondary garages, or budget-conscious installations** where the door simply needs to go up and down safely, every time.

Smart Home Capability

The Secure does not include a Smart Hub, but it is not locked out of the ecosystem entirely. You can add **optional Smart Phone Control** (MC0006 Smart Hub Control Kit) later if your needs change. This means you are not making a permanent decision against connectivity by choosing the Secure today.

B&D; Smart (SDO-7V3): The Sweet Spot for Most Homes

The B&D; Smart builds on the Secure's solid foundation and adds the connected features that most modern homeowners expect. It hits a genuine sweet spot: capable enough for everyday smart home use without stepping into premium pricing.

Who Is the Smart For?

The B&D; Smart is the ideal choice for **most Australian households**. If you want to open and close your garage door from your phone, receive notifications when someone arrives home, and integrate your garage into your connected lifestyle — without paying for the top-tier model — the Smart is your opener.

It is particularly well-suited for **families who value convenience**, homeowners who occasionally forget to close the garage, and anyone who wants a modern opener at a mid-range price.

Smart Hub: Already Installed

Unlike the Secure, the Smart comes with its **Smart Hub already installed** from the factory. This is a significant difference — you do not need to purchase a separate Smart Phone Control Kit (MC0006). Simply download the B&D; app, connect the opener to your home Wi-Fi network during installation, and you are ready to go.

B&D; Smart Pro (SDO-9V3): The Premium Powerhouse

The B&D; Smart Pro sits at the top of the sectional opener range. It is engineered for homeowners who want the most capability, the highest door weight capacity, and a fully connected experience without compromise.

Who Is the Smart Pro For?

The Smart Pro is built for **large, heavy garage doors** — think wide double doors, insulated panels, or solid timber doors that push well past the 235 kg mark. If your door is close to or above 235 kg, the Smart Pro is not just the better choice — it is the necessary one.

It is also the pick for homeowners who prioritise **quiet operation**. The Smart Pro's slower travel speed (125 mm/sec vs 180 mm/sec) means noticeably less noise, especially in garages attached to living spaces or bedrooms.

Built-In Wi-Fi: No Add-Ons Needed

Like the Smart, the Smart Pro comes with the **Smart Hub pre-installed**. The difference is raw capability — the Smart Pro's more powerful motor and higher force ratings mean it can handle the demands of heavier doors while maintaining smooth, controlled operation through the app.

Dual LED Courtesy Lights

Where the Secure and Smart each provide **one LED module**, the Smart Pro doubles it with **two LED courtesy light modules**. This makes a real difference in large garages where a single light source leaves dark corners.

Smart Home Deep Dive: Connectivity Compared

The smart home capability is one of the biggest differentiators across the range. Here is exactly how each model handles connected features.

B&D; Secure: Smart-Ready, Not Smart-Equipped

The Secure does not ship with a Smart Hub. To add smartphone control, you need to purchase the **B&D; Smart Phone Control Kit (MC0006)**, which includes the Smart Hub and transceiver. Alternatively, you can purchase the **Smart Hub only (MC0008)** or **Transceiver only (MC0009)** if you already have one component.

Important compatibility note: Openers manufactured prior to 1 May 2016 may not be compatible with the Smart Phone Control Kit. Check with your B&D; representative if your unit is older.

B&D; Smart and Smart Pro: Connected Out of the Box

Both the Smart and Smart Pro ship with the **Smart Hub already installed**. Setup involves:

1. Downloading the B&D; app to your smartphone.
2. Ensuring travel limits are set on the opener before connecting.
3. Pressing the MODE button to activate the network LED (hotspot mode, indicated by a purple LED).
4. Connecting your phone to the B&D; network via Wi-Fi settings.
5. Following the in-app instructions to link to your home Wi-Fi network.

What Can the App Do?

Once connected, the B&D; app gives you:

- **Remote open and close** — operate your garage door from anywhere with a cellular or Wi-Fi connection.
- **Visitor access** — grant temporary access to family members, tradespeople, or delivery drivers without sharing your physical remote.
- **Activity log** — see a history of when the door was opened and closed, and by which user.
- **Real-time status** — check whether your garage door is open or closed at any time.
- **Push notifications** — receive alerts when the door is operated.

A Critical Safety Note for Smart Control

When using smartphone control, the opener allows operation of the door when not in line-of-sight. This means the door may operate unexpectedly for anyone near it. B&D; mandates that **Safety Beams must be fitted** whenever a smart device is used to operate the door remotely. This is not optional — it is a safety requirement under AS/NZS 60335-2-95:2020.

Which Doors Can Each Opener Handle?

Understanding door weight limits is critical to choosing the right opener. An undersized opener will not just perform poorly — it can be unsafe and void your warranty.

Door Weight Capacity

- **Secure and Smart:** Maximum **235 kg** gross door weight, including all fittings (tracks, hardware, springs, and panels).
- **Smart Pro:** Maximum **300 kg** gross door weight, including all fittings.

This 65 kg difference is substantial. A standard single-car sectional door typically weighs between 60 kg and 100 kg. A double-car door can range from 80 kg to 180 kg. Insulated doors, timber-look panels, or oversized custom doors can push well beyond 200 kg — and that is where the Smart Pro becomes essential.

Door Area

All three models share the same **maximum door area of 18 m²**. For reference, a standard double garage door (approximately 5 m wide × 2.4 m high) is 12 m², well within the limit.

Spring Balance Requirements

Regardless of which opener you choose, the door must be properly balanced with springs so that the ****maximum lifting force under spring tension does not exceed 200 N (20 kg)****. This applies equally to the Secure, Smart, and Smart Pro. If your door is not properly spring-balanced, no opener in this range should be installed until the springs are adjusted or replaced.

Door Types

All three openers are designed for ****sectional garage doors**** — doors that consist of horizontal panels connected by hinges, which roll up along vertical and horizontal tracks. They are not designed for roller doors, tilt doors, or sliding doors (separate B&D; opener ranges cover those applications).

Safety Features: Keeping Your Family Protected

Garage door safety is governed by strict Australian standards, and B&D; takes compliance seriously across the entire range.

Safety Beams (Mandatory for Post-2020 Installations)

Under ****AS/NZS 60335-2-95:2020****, Safety Beams must be fitted to the opener if:

1. ****The closing force at the bottom edge of the door exceeds 400 N (40 kg)****, and/or
2. ****The opener has a smart device fitted to operate the door when not in line-of-sight.****

In practice, this means virtually all modern installations require Safety Beams. All three models in the Controll-A-Door® sectional range come with ****Safety Beams included as standard**** — you do not need to purchase them separately.

How Safety Beams Work

The Safety Beam Kit projects an infrared beam across the door opening at low level. When an obstruction (a car, child, pet, or object) breaks the beam while the door is closing, the beam sends a signal to the opener to ****immediately reverse or stop the door****. The Safety Beam must be installed and connected before travel limits are set during installation.

Automatic Safety Reverse

Beyond the Safety Beams, all three openers include built-in ****obstruction detection through force monitoring****. If the door encounters unexpected resistance during closing — from hitting an object the beams did not catch, for example — the opener reverses the door automatically.

LED Status Indicators

The Smart and Smart Pro feature a comprehensive LED status system that communicates the door's current state:

These visual and audible indicators make it easy to diagnose issues at a glance — particularly useful for installers and homeowners troubleshooting problems.

Battery Backup: Power Outages Sorted

Losing mains power should not mean losing access to your garage. Here is how each model handles backup power.

Secure: Optional Battery Backup

The Secure does not include battery backup as standard. However, you can add an **optional battery backup kit** to ensure continued operation during power outages.

Smart: Standard Battery Backup

The Smart includes **battery backup as standard**, giving you immediate out-of-the-box protection against power outages.

Smart Pro: Dual Battery Backup Kits Included

The Smart Pro goes a step further with **two battery backup kits included as standard**. This provides extended backup capacity for homeowners in areas prone to extended outages.

Battery Performance

Across all models (when fitted with battery backup), the system provides:

- **Approximately 10 cycles** (open and close operations) on a full charge.
- **Average cycle time of 90 seconds** per operation under battery power.
- **Battery specifications:** 2.3 Ah sealed lead-acid batteries.
- **Recharge time:** 24–48 hours to reach full charge from flat.
- **Expected battery lifespan:** 4–5 years under normal conditions.

B&D; recommends **monthly testing** of the battery backup system. If the door operates slowly or weakly during a test, allow the batteries to recharge for the full 24–48 hour period before testing again.

Noise Comparison: How Quiet Is Each Opener?

Noise is a genuine concern, particularly for garages attached to or beneath living spaces. While B&D; does not publish specific decibel ratings for these models, the specifications reveal meaningful differences.

Chain Drive Across the Range

All three openers in this range use a **chain drive system**. Chain drives are proven, durable, and well-suited to the Australian climate, but they do produce more mechanical noise than belt-drive alternatives.

Speed and Noise

The most significant noise differentiator is **travel speed**:

- **Secure and Smart:** 180 mm/sec — faster but noisier.
- **Smart Pro:** 125 mm/sec — approximately 30% slower, which translates to noticeably quieter operation.

The slower speed of the Smart Pro is not a drawback — it is a design choice. By moving the door more slowly, the opener reduces chain vibration, track noise, and panel rattle. For bedrooms above or beside the garage, this difference is immediately noticeable.

Speed Adjustment

Remember that all three models offer three speed settings (Fast, Medium, Slow). If noise is a concern with the Secure or Smart, you can reduce the drive speed during installation. However, the Smart Pro's combination of slower default speed and higher force capacity means it moves heavy doors more

smoothly and quietly than the other two models can achieve even at their slowest setting.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I upgrade from a Secure to a Smart later?

Not directly — the Secure (SDO-6V3) and Smart (SDO-7V3) are different units. However, you can add smartphone control to the Secure by purchasing the B&D; Smart Phone Control Kit (MC0006), which gives you app-based control without replacing the entire opener.

Do all three models require professional installation?

Yes. B&D; requires professional installation for all Controll-A-Door® sectional openers. This ensures correct spring balancing, travel limit setting, safety beam installation, and compliance with AS/NZS standards.

Are Safety Beams included with all three models?

Yes. The Safety Beam Kit is included as standard with the Secure, Smart, and Smart Pro. Safety Beams are mandatory under AS/NZS 60335-2-95:2020 for most installations.

How do I know if my door is too heavy for the Secure or Smart?

Your door's gross weight includes the panels, tracks, hardware, springs, and all fittings. If the total exceeds 235 kg, you need the Smart Pro (rated to 300 kg). Your installer can weigh the door or check the manufacturer's specifications during the quoting process.

Can the Smart Pro handle a single-car door, or is it only for double doors?

The Smart Pro works perfectly well with single-car doors. While its 300 kg capacity and higher force ratings are designed for heavier doors, lighter doors benefit from its quieter operation and dual LED courtesy lights. There is no minimum door weight requirement.

How long does the battery backup last during a power outage?

The battery backup provides approximately 10 open-and-close cycles on a full charge. Each cycle takes about 90 seconds. After an extended power outage, batteries need 24–48 hours of mains power to fully recharge.

What is the B&D; 10-Year Total Confidence Warranty?

When you purchase a complete B&D; door and opener system (both must be B&D; products) and register online, selected components are covered for up to 10 years. Visit bnd.com.au for full warranty terms and conditions.

Can I use the B&D; app with the Secure model?

Only if you purchase the optional Smart Phone Control Kit (MC0006). Without it, the Secure operates via remote transmitters and wall-mounted buttons only.

What happens if the Safety Beams malfunction?

If the Safety Beams fail or become misaligned, the opener will typically prevent the door from closing as a safety precaution. The status LEDs will indicate the fault. Contact your B&D; installer for realignment or replacement.

Is there a belt-drive option in this range?

No. The Secure, Smart, and Smart Pro all use chain drive systems. Chain drives offer excellent durability and reliability in the Australian climate.

The Verdict: Which B&D; Opener Should You Choose?

By Budget: B&D; Secure

If cost is the primary consideration and you do not need smartphone control, the **Secure** delivers all the fundamentals — Tri-Tran+ security, Safety Beams, auto-reverse, and a 235 kg door capacity — at the most accessible price point. You can always add smart control later with the MC0006 kit.

By Smart Home Needs: B&D; Smart

For most homeowners who want app-based control, visitor access, and activity monitoring, the **Smart** is the clear winner. The Smart Hub is already installed, so there is nothing extra to buy. It shares the same 235 kg capacity and 225 W motor as the Secure, so you are not sacrificing any mechanical capability.

By Door Size and Weight: B&D; Smart Pro

If your sectional door weighs more than 200 kg — or is anywhere near the 235 kg limit — the **Smart Pro** is the safe and sensible choice. Its 300 kg capacity, 1,400 N peak force, and 450 N rated load give it genuine headroom for heavy, insulated, or oversized doors. You will never worry about the opener straining.

By Noise Sensitivity: B&D; Smart Pro

The Smart Pro's slower 125 mm/sec travel speed makes it the **quietest option** in the range. If your garage is attached to living areas, bedrooms, or a home office, the reduced noise is worth the investment on its own.

The Bottom Line

The B&D; Controll-A-Door® sectional range gives you a genuine choice at every level. The **Secure** is an honest, reliable opener that does the job well. The **Smart** adds connected convenience at a fair step up in price. And the **Smart Pro** is the opener you buy when you want the best — more power, more capacity, quieter operation, and dual courtesy lights, all with smart home control built in.

All three share B&D's core engineering: Tri-Tran+ security, Safety Beams, auto-reverse, and eligibility for the 10-Year Total Confidence Warranty. Whichever you choose, you are getting an opener built to Australian standards and backed by one of the country's original garage door brands.
