The **Roll-A-Door** sits in the mid-range sweet spot, offering a significant jump in durability with its 7-year curtain warranty, Nylofelt® guide system, and proven performance over 30,000 cycles. The **Roll-A-Door Neo** is B&D;'s premium roller, engineered for tighter installations, enhanced security with the AutoLock mechanism, and a refined design that suits modern homes where the garage is a prominent facade element.

If you are building your forever home, the Roll-A-Door or Roll-A-Door Neo will repay the investment over time. If you need a reliable door without the premium price tag — think rental properties, secondary garages, or rural sheds — the Rollmasta gets the job done.

The B&D; Roller Door Lineup: Entry, Mid-Range, and Premium

B&D; Garage Doors & Openers manufactures three distinct roller door tiers for the Australian residential market. Each uses the same fundamental continuous-curtain rolling mechanism — steel slats that coil around a spring-loaded barrel above the opening — but they differ meaningfully in materials, engineering, warranty coverage, and long-term cost of ownership.

Understanding the lineup matters because roller doors are not a purchase you make every year. A door installed today will likely be opening and closing multiple times daily for a decade or more. The differences between tiers compound over that timeframe in ways that the initial price tag does not fully capture.

Rollmasta (Model R1R) — B&D;'s Series 1 entry-level roller door. Built for value, with steel curtain construction, galvanised steel guides, and a 1-year curtain warranty.

Roll-A-Door — B&D;'s mid-range workhorse, available in Series 1, 2, and 3 configurations. Features the proprietary Nylofelt® guide strip system, a 7-year steel curtain warranty, and COLORBOND® steel finish options. Series 2 and 3 are rated for all wind regions.

Roll-A-Door Neo (Model R1N) — B&D;'s premium roller door with the AutoLock security system, refined curtain profiles, and flexible installation options including limited-sideroom front mount capability. Designed for modern homes where the garage door is a key part of the facade.

Rollmasta Deep Dive

What It Is

The Rollmasta carries the model code R1R and sits within B&D's Series 1 product family. It is a steel roller door designed for the budget-conscious buyer who needs a functional, reliable door without premium features.

- **Budget-conscious homeowners** building or renovating on a tight budget - **Rental property investors** who need a functional door without premium pricing - **Sheds and workshops** where aesthetics are secondary to function - **Secondary garages** or carports where the door is not a prominent facade element - **Rural and regional builds** where cost-effectiveness is the priority

Limitations

The 1-year curtain warranty tells you what B&D thinks about the Rollmasta's long-term material endurance compared to its Roll-A-Door siblings. It does not mean the door will fail after a year — B&D's steel curtains are robust — but the manufacturer is less willing to back the curtain material over extended periods at this price point.

The Rollmasta also lacks the Nylofelt® guide strip system found in the Roll-A-Door range. Standard steel guides with grease lubrication work well, but they require more frequent maintenance to keep the door running smoothly and quietly.

Roll-A-Door Deep Dive

What It Is

The Roll-A-Door is B&D's flagship roller door brand and the product that built the company's reputation in Australian garages. Available in Series 1, 2, and 3 configurations, it offers a significant step up from the Rollmasta in every measurable dimension.

Key Specifications

The 30,000-Cycle Pedigree

B&D; subjects the Roll-A-Door to cyclic loading testing that validates performance across tens of thousands of open-close cycles. Wind load testing data exists for Series 1, 2, and 3 models under these cyclic conditions, confirming that the door maintains structural integrity and smooth operation over its rated service life.

For a typical household that opens and closes their garage door four times daily, 30,000 cycles equates to roughly 20 years of daily use — a lifespan that aligns with the Roll-A-Door's reputation as a buy-once proposition.

The Nylofelt® Advantage

Nylofelt® is B&D;'s proprietary running strip material bonded inside the door guides. Unlike the Rollmasta's steel-on-steel guide system that requires grease lubrication, Nylofelt® provides a low-friction surface that:

- **Reduces operational noise** — the curtain glides rather than scrapes
- **Eliminates the need for grease** — in fact, grease must never be applied to Nylofelt® as it damages the material and impairs operation
- **Requires minimal maintenance** — periodic cleaning with a cloth dampened with mineral turpentine or methylated spirits, followed by silicon spray

Critical Maintenance Note: If Nylofelt® running strips slip from the guide edge, the door can jam. B&D; recommends checking your Roll-A-Door operation at least every six months — more frequently in extreme environments or with heavy use. If Nylofelt® is cut or damaged, a lighted match can be used to quickly seal the ends of the nylon braiding and prevent further deterioration. Never use WD-40 or similar oil-based products, as these are not silicon-based and will clog the material.

Warranty Coverage

The Roll-A-Door's warranty reflects its mid-range positioning:

- **7 years** on the steel door curtain (covers steel cracking and lock seam failure with associated labour)
- **1 year** on the locking mechanism and all other components

The jump from 1 year (Rollmasta) to 7 years (Roll-A-Door) on the curtain warranty is the single most telling difference between the two products. B&D; is backing the Roll-A-Door's curtain material seven times longer, which speaks directly to the quality of the steel and the paint system used.

COLORBOND® Steel Finish

Roll-A-Door curtains are finished in BlueScope COLORBOND® steel, pre-painted with a silicone modified polyester formulation that is recognised as one of the best paint films commercially available. This finish is specifically designed and tested for the harsh Australian climate, including UV exposure, salt air, and industrial fallout environments.

To maintain the finish, B&D; recommends washing the door every 14 days with clean water and a cloth. Properties in corrosive environments — coastal or industrial areas — require more frequent washing.

Roll-A-Door Neo Deep Dive

What It Is

The Roll-A-Door Neo (Model R1N) represents B&D's premium roller door offering. It builds on the Roll-A-Door's proven platform while adding modern security features, installation flexibility, and a refined design language suited to contemporary Australian homes.

Key Specifications

The AutoLock Security System

The standout feature of the Roll-A-Door Neo is the **AutoLock** mechanism, specifically designed for R1N doors. Unlike conventional roller door locking systems that rely on manual shoot bolts or slide bolts, the AutoLock engages automatically when the door closes, providing security without requiring the homeowner to remember to lock up.

The AutoLock system is designed for both side mount and front mount installations, with the lock bolt engineered to fully engage without interference across both configurations. Installation requires proper bracket positioning and testing to ensure reliable engagement.

Limited Sideroom Capability

One of the Neo's engineering advantages is its ability to install in garages with restricted sideroom. The front mount configuration requires just **90mm of sideroom** from the inside guide to the edge of the bracket/AutoLock assembly — a significant advantage for narrow garages, townhouses, and renovations where space beside the opening is limited.

Standard side mount installation requires 135mm of sideroom, which is comparable to other Series 1 doors.

What Justifies the Upgrade

The Roll-A-Door Neo makes sense when you need:

1. **Automatic security** — the AutoLock removes the human error factor from garage security
2. **Limited sideroom flexibility** — the 90mm front mount option solves real-world installation constraints
3. **Increased curtain overlap** — 40mm per side vs 30mm provides better light blocking and weathersealing
4. **Premium aesthetics** — the Neo's refined curtain profiles are designed for homes where the garage door is a prominent feature
5. **Modern installation compatibility** — purpose-built for contemporary builds with tighter tolerances

Total Cost of Ownership

The sticker price of a garage door is only the beginning of the story. Here is how the three tiers compare when you factor in service life, maintenance, and warranty coverage.

Upfront Cost

The Rollmasta is the most affordable option in B&D's roller door range. The Roll-A-Door commands a moderate premium, and the Roll-A-Door Neo sits at the top of the price ladder. Contact your local B&D; Accredited Dealer for current pricing, as costs vary by door size, colour selection, and installation complexity.

Service Life

All three doors are built to last in Australian conditions. However, the Roll-A-Door's 7-year curtain warranty and cyclic loading test pedigree give buyers greater confidence in long-term curtain integrity. For a door that opens four times daily, the Roll-A-Door's tested cycle life suggests a 15-to-20-year service life with proper maintenance.

The Rollmasta will also last many years with proper care, but the shorter warranty period reflects a different expectation from the manufacturer regarding the curtain's long-term endurance.

Maintenance Costs

****Rollmasta:**** Requires periodic grease application to the steel guide channels. This is low-cost but must be done consistently to prevent noise, sticking, and premature wear. General-purpose grease on internal guide surfaces is recommended, along with regular cleaning.

****Roll-A-Door and Roll-A-Door Neo:**** The Nylofelt® guide system eliminates grease entirely. Maintenance involves wiping guides with mineral turpentine or methylated spirits and applying silicon spray. The time and cost per service visit is comparable, but the risk of guide-related issues from neglected lubrication is eliminated.

Warranty Value

Over a 10-year ownership period:

- ****Rollmasta:**** 1 year of curtain warranty coverage = 10% of a decade covered - ****Roll-A-Door:**** 7 years of curtain warranty coverage = 70% of a decade covered - ****Roll-A-Door Neo:**** AutoLock and

components covered for 1 year; curtain warranty per B&D; tier

The Roll-A-Door's 7-year curtain warranty is, in financial terms, a form of insurance. If the curtain develops steel cracking or lock seam failure within that period, B&D; covers the repair including labour. That is meaningful peace of mind for a component that is difficult and expensive to replace.

Opener Pairing: Power Drive vs Roll-A-Pro

All three roller doors can be automated with B&D;'s roller door openers. The two key options are the **Power Drive** and the **Roll-A-Pro**, which share core specifications:

Roll-A-Door + Roll-A-Pro: The proven mid-range combination. The Roll-A-Pro's smooth chain drive complements the Roll-A-Door's Nylofelt® guide system for quiet, reliable operation. This pairing maximises the Roll-A-Door's engineered smoothness.

Roll-A-Door Neo + Roll-A-Pro: The premium pairing. The Roll-A-Pro works seamlessly with the Neo's AutoLock system, providing automated locking and unlocking as part of the open-close cycle. This combination delivers the full Neo experience — automatic security, smooth operation, and modern convenience.

All doors retain manual operation capability when the drive unit is disengaged, providing fail-safe access during power outages.

First Home Buyer

Recommended: Roll-A-Door

Your first home is likely where you will discover just how often you use your garage door. The Roll-A-Door's 7-year curtain warranty provides peace of mind during the years when money is typically tight and unexpected repair bills hurt the most. The Nylofelt® system means lower maintenance effort, and the COLORBOND® finish keeps the facade looking sharp as your new neighbourhood settles.

Recommended: Roll-A-Door Neo

If you are building or renovating the home you plan to live in for decades, the Roll-A-Door Neo's premium features pay dividends over time. The AutoLock provides set-and-forget security. The refined

curtain profiles complement modern architectural styles. And the limited-sideroom front mount option gives your architect and builder more design flexibility.

Rental or Investment Property

****Recommended: Rollmasta****

Tenants need a functional garage door that opens, closes, and locks. The Rollmasta delivers all three reliably at the lowest upfront cost. The 1-year curtain warranty is less of a concern when the door is part of a rental yield calculation — and the Rollmasta's steel construction is robust enough for the less-than-gentle treatment rental doors sometimes receive.

Shed, Workshop, or Secondary Garage

****Recommended: Rollmasta****

For non-primary structures where the door is functional rather than decorative, the Rollmasta's value proposition is compelling. Available in sizes up to 5,500mm wide and 3,600mm tall, it covers most shed and workshop openings. The galvanised steel guides are simple to maintain, and manual operation is straightforward for buildings without permanent power.

Coastal or High-Wind Area

****Recommended: Roll-A-Door (Series 2 or 3)****

If your property is in a cyclone-rated wind region or a coastal zone with severe weather exposure, the Roll-A-Door in Series 2 or 3 configuration is rated for all wind regions. Combined with the COLORBOND® finish's corrosion resistance (with more frequent washing in salt-air environments), this is the combination engineered for Australia's most demanding conditions.

Tight Garage or Townhouse

****Recommended: Roll-A-Door Neo****

With just 90mm of sideroom required in front mount configuration, the Roll-A-Door Neo solves the installation challenge that plagues many inner-city townhouses and narrow garages. If your builder or installer has flagged sideroom constraints, the Neo may be your only viable B&D; roller door option — and a very good one.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Can I upgrade from a Rollmasta to a Roll-A-Door later?

Yes. The Rollmasta and Roll-A-Door share the same fundamental roller door architecture. However, upgrading typically means replacing the entire door assembly — curtain, guides, and barrel — rather than swapping individual components. It is a full door replacement, not a retrofit. Your B&D; Accredited Dealer can assess your existing installation and advise on the upgrade path.

2. Does the Rollmasta come in COLORBOND® colours?

The Rollmasta features a pre-painted finish using a silicone modified polyester formulation designed for Australian conditions. The available colour range may differ from the Roll-A-Door and Roll-A-Door Neo. Contact your B&D; dealer for the current Rollmasta colour options.

3. How often do I need to maintain the Nylofelt® strips?

B&D; recommends checking your Roll-A-Door or Roll-A-Door Neo at least every six months — more frequently in extreme environments, coastal areas, or with heavy daily use. Maintenance involves

wiping the inside of each guide with a cloth dampened with mineral turpentine or methylated spirits, then applying silicon spray. Never use WD-40 or oil-based products. Never apply grease to Nylofelt® strips.

4. Is the AutoLock on the Roll-A-Door Neo compatible with all openers?

The AutoLock is specifically designed for the Roll-A-Door Neo (R1N) and is engineered to work with B&D's roller door openers. When paired with the Roll-A-Pro or Power Drive, the AutoLock engages and disengages automatically as part of the door's open-close cycle. Contact your installer to confirm compatibility with your specific opener configuration.

5. Can I install a Roll-A-Door Neo with a side mount opener in a narrow garage?

Yes. The Roll-A-Door Neo supports both side mount (135mm sideroom required) and front mount (90mm sideroom required) configurations. The front mount option was specifically engineered for narrow garage applications, making the Neo a practical choice for townhouses and tight renovations.

6. What is the difference between Series 1, 2, and 3?

Series 1 is B&D's standard configuration, suitable for most residential applications and available with Wind-Locked options for Region C. Series 2 and Series 3 are engineered for use in all wind regions, providing greater curtain overlap (50mm+ per side in Series 3), enhanced wind load resistance, and certification for cyclone-rated areas. The Rollmasta and Roll-A-Door Neo are Series 1 products; the Roll-A-Door is available across all three series.

7. How does the Roll-A-Door's 7-year warranty compare to industry standards?

B&D's 7-year steel curtain warranty on the Roll-A-Door is one of the strongest in the Australian roller door market. By comparison, the Rollmasta carries a 1-year curtain warranty. The warranty covers steel cracking and lock seam failure including associated labour, which means B&D bears the full cost of curtain-related defects for seven years — a significant commitment that reflects the quality of the Roll-A-Door's steel and COLORBOND® finish.

8. Do all three doors work as manual (non-automated) doors?

Yes. All three doors — Rollmasta, Roll-A-Door, and Roll-A-Door Neo — can be operated manually. When the drive unit is disengaged (or if no opener is installed), the door operates via the spring-loaded barrel mechanism. This provides fail-safe access during power outages and makes the doors suitable for buildings without permanent electrical supply. The Roll-A-Door Neo's AutoLock functions as a manual lock in non-automated installations.
